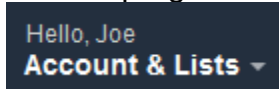
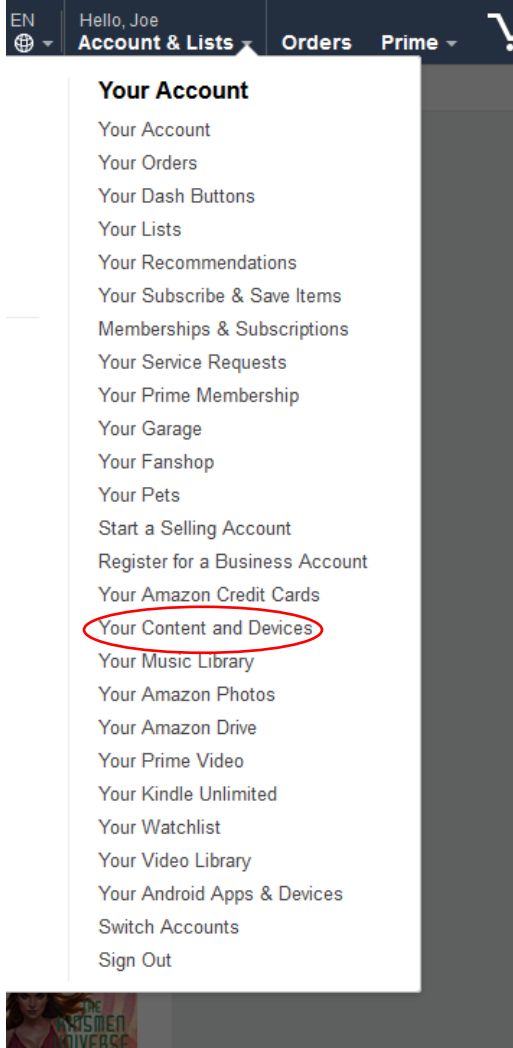


# Send to Kindle Setup Instructions

1. From a computer, login to your Amazon account.
2. In the top-right corner, click on **Account & Lists**



3. When you see this dropdown list, click on **Your Content and Devices**



4. At the top of the page, you'll see these Menu tabs, with Content highlighted. Click on the **Preferences** tab

5. Along the left side, you'll see several options, as shown here. Click on **Personal Document Settings**.

## Personal Document Settings

Kindle Personal Documents service makes it easy to take your personal documents with you, eliminating the need to print. You and your approved contacts can send documents to your device by e-mailing the documents to your Send-to-Kindle e-mail address. You can also send documents to your Kindle using Send to Kindle, which is available to download for free at [www.amazon.com/sendtokindle](http://www.amazon.com/sendtokindle). [Learn more](#)

You may only have one, or many. [Make a note of one of them.](#) It doesn't matter which one. I'm choosing my iPad Pro because all the other ones are defunct, and I just haven't deleted them.

7. Immediately below the above, you'll see **Personal Document Archiving**, like this:

### Personal Document Archiving

When this option is enabled, personal documents sent to your **Send-to-Kindle e-mail address** will also be added to your Kindle library.

8. Next, you'll see the following list. More than likely, the email address you use to login to Amazon will be listed, but possibly not. The list may be blank.

Click the link to **Add a new approved e-mail address**. If your email address is not listed, be sure to add it. Also, add **@subtledemon.com**. If you add it just like that, with nothing to the left of the @ symbol, then any email coming from anyone at subtledemon.com will be accepted. (Most likely just me, but you never know.) When you click the link, it will look like this:

#### Add a new approved e-mail address

Enter an approved e-mail address.

Tip: Enter a partial address, such as @yourcompany.com, to authorize multiple senders.

Fill in the information and click the **Add Address** button, and you're done with this part!

## Send to Kindle Setup Instructions

9. To send a document to your kindle device/app, compose an email addressed to your send-to-kindle email address you made note of in Step 6. Make sure you are sending from the personal email address listed for you in Step 8.
10. Attach the document you want to send to your kindle. Don't send a link, send the actual document as an attachment. You can send almost any kind of documents that have the following extensions: .mobi, .docx, .pdf, .png, .jpg, .gif and .epub. Amazon will convert the document automatically so it can be viewed on your kindle device/app.

Please note, if you're sending a .mobi or .epub e-book file, it must not have DRM (Digital Rights Management). If it does, Amazon will not convert it.

None of Connie's books have DRM and will be accepted by Amazon.

11. As an example using the information above, I would compose an email **to** joe.scholes\_63@kindle.com **from** my joe.scholes68@gmail.com account. I would then attach the document I want on my kindle and send it.

A subject for the email is not required, and any text you put in the body of the email will be ignored. Amazon is only interested in the attachment.

From this point forward, you can send as many documents as you want to your kindle device/app. It will take a few minutes for the document to appear on your kindle device/app, and it may not appear along with kindle books you've purchased. However, if you don't see it in the list, tap the menu icon (3 horizontal bars) and then click Docs.

If you have more than one kindle device or app registered with Amazon, documents you send this way will sync across all your devices, including your notes and highlights.
